Sixth Form Students are expected to dress appropriately and professionally for their studies. This standard would be similar to clothes worn in a business environment. This dress code considers the more relaxed style of business wear that is now worn in professional environments.

<p>Appropriate: Torso Shirts / Blouses Polo Shirts / Polo Necks Cardigans and Jumpers (loose knit) Shoulder Straps – appropriate width Blazer Tie Quarter Zip Jumpers</p>	<p>Inappropriate: Torso No Hoodies No Low Cut Clothing No Excessively Tight Clothing No Tank Tops – any item showing torso</p>
<p>Appropriate: Lower Body Chinos / Trousers Skirts – no shorter than 10 cm above the knee Suit Trousers</p>	<p>Inappropriate: Lower Body No Leggings (unless under skirts or for Sport Lessons) No Jogging Bottoms No Shorts No Clothing Dragging on the Floor</p>
<p>Appropriate: Shoes All shoes should be clean: Boots Smart Coloured Shoes Heels – safe height for workplace</p>	<p>Inappropriate: Shoes No Trainers (except for during Sports lessons) No Open Toed Shoes No Knee Length Boots</p>
<p>Appropriate: Sports Wear Sportswear may only be worn for Sports lessons, when instructed by the teacher: Tracksuit Trousers Polo Shirts Sport T-Shirt Trainers Sport Shorts Sport Leggings</p>	<p>Additional Information: No Ripped or Torn Clothing No Logos/Texts No Un-Tucked Shirts No Pockets Down the Leg – Cargos No Facial Piercings - Nose piercings may be worn, that are either a small single stud or small hoop. No Ear tapers, flesh tunnels and flesh or visible piercings other than ear or nose. Appropriate hair colours.</p>
